Glancing up in my closet, I noticed all my "Christmas" totes. Filled with shiny Christmas baubles, sleighs and snowmen, nativities, advent calendars, and strings and strings of multicolored lights, they would soon be coming down. The Christmas season would be upon us in no time. By my calendar, Advent is just 48 days away!

Past Christmas memories would work their way into the opening and unloading of these totes. Special memories of family gatherings, Christmas Eve programs, and yummy food would come to mind.

For me, I remember that Advents and Christmases were resplendent with "lights" — beautifully lit Christmas trees, candles glowing in windows and on altars, houses drenched in thousands of lights. The world seemed to be aglow more than at any other season. I remember staring at the lights till my vision blurred into one huge glow of luminous beauty.

I fondly remember the "luminaries" set out for night services. As a child I was in awe that small sacks with sand and lighted candles could show my path to the church door. (On a cold, dark night, **light** is <u>very</u> important to a child! And, also an adult, I found out.) I couldn't know then that my last grandson would be named Lumen (Latin for light), and he would light up my heart with joy and love. I have my very own <u>Lumen</u>-ary!

Psalm 119:105 tells us about the **most important light** of all and for all. *Your Word is a lamp for my feet and a light on my path.* Of course, the Psalmist speaks of **JESUS**. As a child and later as an adult, Jesus was showing me His light, and the path I was to take. Every time I entered His house, I would hear The Word of His birth, death, resurrection, and His promise to return for me and all believers. He did the same for every hearer and doer of His Word. That is what I call **ILLUMINATION!**

The LWML Sunday and Bible Study materials from Romans 8:31–39 reminds us of all the things that cannot separate us from the love of God.



Your Mite offerings are making a difference. Two more mission grants have been **PAID IN FULL!!!!**

Living by Faith, Not by Sight Amount \$5,000 Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW), Idaho Falls, Idaho

The goal for this grant is to offset the cost of production of Braille and Specialized large print Bibles and other Christian materials at the LBW Ministry Production Center in Idaho Falls over the next two years. Any remaining funds will be used at the national level for the same purpose.

Comfort Dog Ministry Amount \$2,500 Trinity Lutheran Church and School, Hicksville, New York

The goal of this grant is to enhance the Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry, specifically for travel expenses that incur when the Comfort Dog Ministry is called upon to provide comfort to those that are hurting. The funds could also act as a matching challenge to encourage gifts from members of the congregation and to send handlers to receive additional training by the LCC staff.

Young Women in Mission

Are you familiar with the term, "YWR?" More specifically, are you familiar with what the YWRs do for the LWML? The term YWR stands for Young Woman Representative and the YWRs have a special place in fulfilling the four primary foci of the LWML.

First, the YWRs proclaim Christ by being active in their LWML societies, sharing the Word of God with fellow members and sharing joy. Second, YWRs support missions through their collection of mites, promotion of mites and the missions grants the LWML funds through spreading knowledge amongst one another. YWRs can share the grace, service and giving of the Lutheran Women in Mission and influence their peers to not only donate their mites as well, but also get involved in the LWML. Third, YWRs are equipped with the ability to do good to do His will. Through fellowship with one another, spending time in the Word and possessing a joyous nature to share in their congregations and in their communities. Moreover, YWRs may be more likely to share the good word of Christ and the LWML on social media platforms, drawing more potential members into the LWML. Finally, YWRs serve others through assisting in planning and participating in LWML society, zone and district events. YWRs are eager to get involved and share their perspectives to influence the future of the LWML and enhance the experiences of other young women in the future.


The LWML National Website (2018) states that, "The LWML is the leading group for LCMS women where each woman is welcomed and encouraged to use her unique God-given gifts as she supports global missions and serves the Lord with gladness."

I would encourage each of you to prayerfully consider sending a YWR to the National Convention. The 2023 National Convention will be held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on June 22

through June 25. The criteria for sending a YWR shall be as follows: she shall be a young woman, aged 22-35. If you are prayerfully considering a woman slightly outside of this age range, that is permissible, also. Further, a YWR should have a deep love and connection to the Lord, have some knowledge of the LWML and should be eager to serve her local society, zone and district with convention experience and delight others with her talents. Moreover, the YWRs are expected to attend all sessions of the convention, report on her zone experience orally or in a written manner with the society, zone or district who nominated her. Lastly, a YWR shall also be invested in her LWML society and encourage other young women to become involved. If you are aware of a potential YWR, please encourage her to pray about the opportunity to serve the Lord with gladness as a member of the LWML. As a prophet, Isaiah had many "Word Lamps" to share with you. (Feel free to read all 66 chapters.) For now, read Isaiah 9:1-7, 49:6, and 60:1-3, where Isaiah speaks of **the light**. What will this light do? To whom will it be given? All were in need of this light. Isaiah was foretelling others just WHO the light was and for the purpose for which it would come. (You might hear more from Isaiah as Advent and Christmas approach.)

In Matthew 5:14-16, Jesus told the multitudes on the mount that they (and we) are the light of the world and the purpose is to show it to the world, not hide it, and give glory to the Father in heaven by our good works. We get to be luminaries ourselves! It is all for God's glory and praise.

He was our light before the world began, and he will forever be the only luminary we will ever need. Revelation 22:3-5 says And there shall be no more curse: but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and his servants shall serve him. And they shall see his face; and his name shall be on their foreheads. And there shall be no night there: and they need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign forever and ever.
