Christ Dispels the Darkness

As of this writing we are still in the Christmas season. It is difficult to reflect on darkness when we are surrounded by beautiful lights all around us. "Why should we reflect on darkness?" you may ask. All the artificial lights will go away after the "season" ends, and when those lights are taken down, there will seem to be darkness where they have been.

John tells us in John 1:5 "*The light shines in darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*" This isn't any artificial light that gets put away when the season ends. John, of course, is referring to Christ, our Lord. In the prior verse, John writes "*In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.*" It is a comfort to know that when we have darkness in our lives, Christ is in the midst of any darkness giving bright and true light to our lives. This light cannot be packed away. No replacement bulbs are needed. Christ's light is everlasting to everlasting.

Recently I went to the Dollar Store (sorry, the \$1.25 store) to get wrapping tape. I noticed a boom box on a top shelf playing Christmas music. As I continued my shopping, a lady walked behind me singing quietly, but loud enough I could hear, "Christ, the Lord." She was singing in the store to "O Come All Ye Faithful" on the boom box. I smiled to myself. She was not afraid of saying the name of our Lord in a public place. (The store wasn't afraid to play Christian music!)

Suddenly I remembered one of the crosses I carry in my purse to give to people. (One of the men in our church carves thousands of wooden crosses as a ministry and they can be taken by anyone to be given away.) I found her in the next aisle and said "I heard you singing about Jesus and wanted you to have this." She looked at the cross in her hand with tears in her eyes and said "You have just made my day. This is a hard time of year for me. Some of my family members are gone, and the others just don't care. This makes me feel Jesus knows." ...

Our trip to Israel last month was a spiritual whirlwind of places and information far beyond anything I imagined before our arrival. I knew we would have spiritual guidance from author Donna Snow but the tour guide, Ori, was more than a wealth of historical, traditional, and biblical insights. Ori means "my light" in Hebrew and he indeed was a light to us Gentiles. He enlightened us about the ministry of Christ in a blessed way in his homeland, reminding me of Simeon's proclamation when he saw the Christchild.

that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel (Luke 2:32–33).

Being able to see the places like Caesarea Philippi where Jesus asked Peter "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You

are the Christ." (Mark 8:29) or standing next to the ruins of Peter's home in Capernaum where Jesus spent time in the nearby synagogue, or reading Jesus's words of the beatitudes while looking out over the Sea of Galilee from the Mount of Beatitudes itself blessed this American pilgrimage beyond measure. It was also a pleasure to have two other Utah-Idaho LWML gals on the tour, Nichelle Dykema and Linda Larson.

Many art depictions of light radiated from places like the Mount of Transfiguration where light emitted from within Jesus and Moses, not from an outside source shining down on them. More reminders that Jesus is our light and salvation even if we live in a dark world.

As we step into the New Year and this season of Epiphany where the Magi followed the light to find the Christ-child, let us also remember to be guided by the light of Jesus. He told us "*I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."* (John 8:12).

Soon (January 9), you will be able to register for the convention in Milwaukie online. If you need help with technology, reach out to a church buddy or someone on the LWML board to help



Hope Lutheran Idaho Falls






