Jesus Heals to Reveal

Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you." He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. (John 9:35-38)

Jesus heals to reveal. He opens our eyes, and he asks us if we believe in him. This is the same question that Jesus asks the disciples in the gospels, "Who do you say that I am"? Who we say Jesus is, is the most important question in one's life. How we answer this question determines our eternal destiny. Jesus is either your Lord or not. The proof is in what follows our response to who Jesus is. Do we worship or carry on with our normal life? A life that confesses Jesus as Lord pursues ways to continually worship him. The Spirit constantly draws us to fix our lives upon Christ and worship. Recall the moment that Jesus revealed himself to you and you realized that your sins were forgiven. At that moment you were completely healed and that healing lasts for eternity. Though this world fades away and these bodies decay, the hope of the resurrection is sure. I pray that our response to who Jesus is would be made known by Spirit-filled worship and service to Christ.



Following the Light

Some of you may have heard this joke:

Through the pitch-black night, a proud captain sees a light dead ahead on a collision course with his ship. He sends a signal: "Change your course 10 degree east."

The light signals back: "Change yours, 10 degrees west."

Angry, the captain sends: "I'm a navy captain! Change your course, sir!"

"I'm a seaman, second class," comes the reply. "Change your course, sir."

Now the captain is furious. "I'm in a battleship! I'm not changing course!"

There is one last reply. "I'm in a lighthouse. Your call."

Sometimes I feel like I should be calling the shots instead of listening to the steady, fixed light of the Gospel. It is difficult to change course when I think I know how to best reach my destination. Preparing for my first national convention as a district president sometimes does not feel like I am on course to get there with all the positions filled, seminar representatives assigned, or documents filed. There is a daily barrage of emails, texts, and requests that I often do not know how to address without research. How do I stay on course?

Every morning, I start by reading scripture. I use the Read Through the Bible in One Year calendar shared on the lwml.org. **[Read Through the Bible in One Year - Lutheran Women's Missionary League \(360unite.com\)](http://www.360unite.com)** I journal and pray that the Holy Spirit will guide me through whatever the day brings. Even though I stumble often, I know where to find my strength and light.

Thankfully, when I leave it all to God, he reveals the most amazing people to accompany me on the journey. After much prayer, the district received applications from two **Young Women Representatives** who will travel with us to Milwaukee. **Jordan Timian** and **Grace Stults** are both faithful Grace Lutheran teachers in Pocatello. I am overjoyed to welcome them to their first national convention.

One of the ways you can add some light to your journey is to attend your Spring Zone Event. The Assembly of Leaders team (pictured here) attended the Central Zone Event in March and will be presenting the same training in each of the other zones in April. We will help shed some light about the mission of the LWML with you.

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

When I turn over my captain duties to the true guiding light, we will not walk in darkness but follow Jesus together.

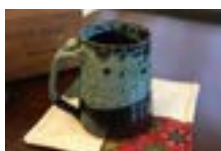

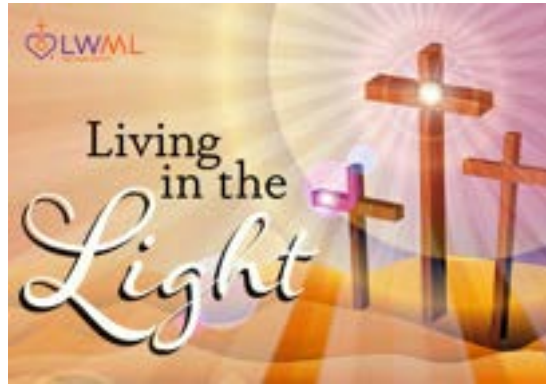
