I snapped off a couple of bone-dry limbs. No life, no fruit. It would have to be replaced. Hmm. This made me think of some "other fruit" spoken of in Galations Chapter 5. Christians could be like my trees—bearing Spiritual fruit abundantly, or, incapable of producing much, if any, sweet fruit. How could Christians be sure they would produce: **Love, Joy**, **Peace, Forbearance, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control**? As I learned about my pear tree, it is what had happened inside. It had developed a bore. It had needed to be properly fed and treated to strengthen it against this devious insect.

We, as Christians, **need the Holy Spirit to strengthen us** through reading and studying God's Word, applying the Gospel to our actions, through unceasing prayer, and through the Sacraments. Only then can we expect for the Holy Spirit to produce the "Juicy Spiritual Fruits" Galations 5:22 speaks of. Those "juicy fruits" are the G A 2 U (otherwise known as the Gospel According To You). The fruits are the way others see us and the Lord Jesus whom we profess.

We need bushels of this Spiritual fruit to give to others (and ourselves). It is how we live out Matthew 5:16 which says "In the same way, let your light (Spiritual fruit, if you will) shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."






