The Power from the Spirit

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth (Acts 1:8).

Do you feel powerful? Sometimes and sometimes not. I would venture to say that we struggle feeling the power of Christ in our lives. May I suggest that we are focused on the wrong source of power. Jesus expresses that he gives us the power of the Holy Spirit to be witnesses of Christ. Though the Spirit helps us live a godly life, the main purpose of the Spirit is to give us power to proclaim Christ to a lost and broken world. The power from the Spirit is expressed in the proclamation of the gospel. Therefore, it is imperative we seek the opportunity to share the love of Christ with others.

Acts 4:33 explains that "with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all." This is a beautiful picture of the desire that God has for his church. We find that the Spirit brings us great power through the testimony of the church. When we gather together, we ought to be intent on encouraging one another to proclaim the testimony of God in Christ. This is where we are assured the power of God to be, in the testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. Again, we feel powerless because we are not testifying of the resurrection, for ourselves, and for others. This requires the active willingness of us asking the Spirit to shift our focus from ourselves and to Christ. May the Lord give you the power to proclaim the resurrected Christ.

Community Outreach

In February 2023 Hope Lutheran Church – Idaho Falls LWML President Betty Oloff was seeking a unique way to celebrate the 176th anniversary of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.

She decided to challenge the congregation to provide 176 "Wish List" items to two local pregnancy centers: Birthright of Idaho Falls and The Shepherd's Inn.

This goal dovetailed with a recent request from the Southern Idaho Chapter of Lutherans for Life that Idaho congregations be aware of and support local pregnancy centers.

Both organizations were contacted by Sandra Biermann and tours provided. This was an opportunity to see the facilities, obtain information and brochures as well as "Wish Lists." This information was then shared with the congregation via a display set up in the church narthex, information placed in the church bulletins and on the webpage as well as regular announcements during services.

In mid-February a Thrivent Action Team request was submitted and approved for funding. The funds were used to fill in items from the "Wish Lists" that were either

not donated or to increase the number of particular items – think diapers.

Anita Taylor, Hope's Outreach Chair, spoke to her physician employer and staff who donated formula and other items. She also spoke with a local hospital representative, which resulted in the hospital pledging a monetary donation to both organizations.

The "Wish Lists" donation deadline was set as April 26 and the first week of May all donations were delivered amid grateful smiles and thanks.

Betty's goal was greatly exceeded as 243 items were delivered! Praise the Lord.

Gifts from the Heart at Convention


