### **Light Typing**

And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. And the word of the Lord was spreading throughout the whole region (Acts 13: 48–49).

Lutheran Women in Mission finished their 40th Biennial LWML Convention in Milwaukee at the end of June. While women Celebrated the Lord of the Nations in the expansive convention center, there was another celebration taking place in Milwaukee; the QWERTYFEST.

Milwaukee has a number of claims to fame like beer, music festivals, Harley Davidson and Arthur Fonzerelli but unbeknownst to most, Milwaukee is also the birthplace of the typewriter. Although patented by Christopher Latham Sholes 150 years ago in 1873, the former newspaper man had never been widely celebrated for his contribution. However on June 24, Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson declared "QWERTY MKE Day" following National Typewriter day on June 23 to rectify this oversight.\*

Once typewriter production became widespread, women poured into the workforce to use them. Men apparently thought early typewriters looked too much like sewing machines and avoided typing jobs, reports typewriter poet Monica Thomas in her "Women's Complicated History." It is admirable that women forged forward with the new word document producer.

Lutheran Women in Mission also have taken up the mantle of spreading the Word. With a 2023-2025 mission goal of \$2,350,000, over 3,500 women witnessed the adoption of 31 mission grants. The missions address issues and ministries from A - Z; A Healing Space for At-Risk Children to Zoes' Home Support and everything in between. These funds will facilitate spreading the Word of God around the world thanks to the men and women who work in God's Kingdom for His purpose. The complete list is found at *lwml.org*.

Sometimes we steer away from new things because we do not think they are meant for us but God often presents us with opportunities that we never imagined. The Gentiles in Acts 13 never knew what they were missing until they were presented with the hope of eternal life.

QWERTYFEST may have had a typewriter orchestra to celebrate their 150 year anniversary, but the LWML celebrated with singing and worship for an eternal God who knows and loves us intimately. Let us thank God for giving us both old and new ways to spread His Word to all generations.

### **The Afterglow Of Camp Perkins**

The 2023 Utah-Idaho Women in Mission Camp Perkins Retreat was over. I had barely written the July newsletter article with memories of going to Camp Perkins, and now, the time had come and gone. It was over for another year. Two short days filled with a mountain-top experience, meaningful Bible study, reconnecting with LWML sisters and church family and friends around a beautiful lake in a beautiful scenic part of God's creation in Idaho was over. I was a little sad.

40 plus Christian sisters gathered together to be spiritually lifted up with God's word, joyful songs, fellowship, and fun. Some ladies might even have gotten some rest and relaxation!

The Retreat Center (RC for short) was abuzz with voices, laughter and activity as Linda, Julie, Barb, Kim and I arrived to check in, get our packets and room assignments. Shortly after putting our luggage in our rooms, the dinner bell clanged and we headed down the hill to the Lodge. Eileen, the Camp Hostess, met us and gave our group and the Single Parent-Children's group needed information and directions for our stay.

After enjoying a yummy dinner (which I didn't have to cook-yeah!) we returned to the RC for the first of three Bible study sessions given by Erinn Schrader from Utah. She focused on the theme "Walking In The Light" from "for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).

Erinn began by telling us that "Light" is used 433 times in the Bible (within 13 different translations). She shared, light was necessary for growing food and for mental and emotional well-being. They provided much laughter as everyone tried to follow the hand-arm movements, jumps, and various contortions that accompanied the songs. And it was very important to make it back to the RC as more fellowship was planned along with outrageous snacks, games and laughter. It was so hard to choose to stay in one place because every little group of ladies was enjoying the evening and I wanted to see what each group was doing.

Up at 6:30 or so because the wonderful smell of coffee came wafting upstairs. Thank you, wonderful ladies, who faithfully prepared the coffee and early morning snacks. (There was no way anyone could have gone hungry this weekend between the snacks and the good meals prepared by the Camp cooks.)

President Terri shared some details from the Convention in Milwaukee and encouraged our LWML societies, Zones, and District to use Lutheran Women in Mission rather than LWML as it is easier to say and says what we do. (I added the "easier to say" part.)

Was that the lunch gong I heard? Free to grab lunch and spend the afternoon choosing our own activities. Drive into Stanley for the Craft Fair? Take a canoe out on the lake? Take a nap? Wait for the store to open so ice cream bars and DIET COKES (Linda did you get enough?) and Camp Perkins merchandise could be purchased?

Cheerful ladies reconvened after dinner (yummy lasagna) for singing and the last Bible study session where we brainstormed how to GLOW UP in God's light, choose wise ways to live, cut out foolish things from our lives and make the most of every opportunity to go and shine our light on others.

After the campfire, we returned to the RC to have a hilariously fun evening playing games (do you know Christian sisters can be ruthless when they want to win a card game?), chatting in groups, **more snacks** and the thought that this fun and fellowship would end tomorrow. It would be *OVER*.

Morning brought worship in the outdoor Chapel overlooking the lake. Worshipping one last time together in this place in God's beautiful creation. After Brett took our group picture, we made our way to the delicious brunch that would send us on our way. 103 campers would be arriving later, taking our places in the lodge for meals, singing around the camp fire, soaking in all the glory of the Holy Spirit working in this place, finding fun and fellowship. Prayerfully growing in Christ. Prayerfully meeting Christ for the first time!

But it wasn't over! All the happenings of these two days were going home with all the ladies. They would remember something special that struck them in the Bible study, the warm hugs and smiles shared over the time spent here. 
### YELLOWSTONE ZONE
