Blinded by the Light

I pulled the sun visor down in front of me as I got into my car. What a day to forget my sunglasses. The sun was glaringly bright and I was driving straight into it. I felt blinded and had to squint as I drove. Sun and light were normally good things, but today the sun was annoying. Could there really be a thing as "too much light"?

I thought about the theme verse "For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." (2 Corinthians 4:6)

For months now the Utah-Idaho Lutheran Women in Mission has been building devotions, Bible Studies, retreats and more around this theme. We were out and about shining our light and pointing to Jesus as God's light. It was certainly easy to let our light shine around other Christian women who were like-minded and knew Jesus as their Lord, their light, and their salvation.

But one day, as I was purposely trying to shine God's light onto a close family member with a different belief system, we talked about belief in "a god" versus faith in **God**. This led to the topic of gays and accepting them as normal couples. She felt her lenient god didn't have a problem so she shouldn't either. This contrasts with our God, who can forgive all sin and loves all people, but He does not overlook sin.

I felt like Saul on the road to Damascus when the light from heaven blinded him. Was I being blinded by having to prove her "god" wrong and my God right? God doesn't need my help for that. I could have spoken about God's love for gay and straight people alike, and His hatred for sin-no matter who it is that sins. I could have spoken that His love for all people is so big that He sacrificed His own Son, Jesus, to cover all sin with His blood on the cross.

As 2 Corinthians 4:6 says above, God put the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ Jesus in me. I wouldn't have it, I wouldn't know we are here to glorify God, I wouldn't know about God if others hadn't told me about God, taken me to church, baptized me, and fed me God's Holy Word.

Knowing this, it is my privilege and continued responsibility to pray for my family members and others so they will seek the one True God. Only the True God can shine the right light into each individual life. It might not be a blinding, glaring light but it will have just the right Intensity-that of the Love of God, our Father.

Different Languages, Same Savior: Lutheran Books for Missionaries Around the World, Amount \$3,000

One example of how the Small Catechisms are being put to use in Thailand. The photos were taken at a Youth Rehab Addiction Center in Chiangrai, in northern Thailand. Some of the children pictured are the children of addicts; others, despite their young age, are addicts themselves. God's Word has never been more needed by these young and hurting ones, who have never before heard of Jesus! In addition to the Small Catechism, clients of the Center also received Bible storybooks and other small gifts.

LWML Bumped into Me

During a recent Yellowstone Zone Event, one of our women made the statement when I was in the mission field, LWML bumped into me.

This statement was worth following up on so I asked Ruth to answer a few questions about her experiences.

When did you go into the mission field? I first went into the mission field in 1964.

Where did you go? I went to Papua New Guinea for three years.

What was your profession? I was a registered nurse with a degree from Valparaiso.

How did LWML bump into you? A lovely lady named Lavada wrote to me while I was in PNG and wanted to know what her ladies' guild could do to help me. We wrote back and forth for a couple of years. The pastor on my station along with local people built me a brand-new bush clinic with funds that were sent to me. Lavada's ladies made and sent about a dozen pairs of curtains for that clinic. She had gotten my name from the LCMS Mission Board in St Louis.

How did LWML serve God through you? I no longer had to deliver babies in a bush clinic, dirty, in the dark with a flash light. I also taught Sunday School to the children in my area; my supplies were sent by the ladies in Kirkwood and other groups.

Do you have one favorite memory of LWML serving through you? MANY!! After I came

home, the ladies of Kansas LWML invited me to do a speaking tour the following Spring (15 times in 13 days). I bumped into former classmates who then lived in Kansas. I met a pastor in Vassar, KS and married him a year and a half later. I left a beautiful little clinic in the jungle in PNG which other nurses used after I left. I was told other LWMLs in Kansas wrote to the nurses there and helped them.

My husband Don, daughter Nan, son Nik, and I went to Liberia as missionaries in the 80's. We received letters and support when we were there. My daughter Nan got some really nice grades when we returned as she wrote excellent reports at school about her experiences. Nan is an active member of LWML.

I know the more you give to the LORD, the more He blesses you!! You can't out-give HIM!!

Is there anything else you want to share with our Utah-Idaho LWML sisters?

I just know that the LORD took my life when I took the call to PNG and again and again, HE has blessed me more than I ever dreamed!!

My mother and her sisters were members of Ladies Aid/LWML at Concordia Kirkwood, Mo for as long as I could remember.

Nan told me that Ruth knew she wanted to be a missionary when she was 8 years old.

What a blessing Ruth was to so many others. To God be the Glory. Amen




