# Have You Seen A Rainbow From The Other Side?

A man in my church asked me one day, "where do bad rainbows go?" I shook my head and thought to myself "there are no bad rainbows." He pun-fully announced "They go to 'Prism' where they have a 'light' sentence and have time to 'reflect'. Oh, groan!

But that started my mind to thinking. I've never seen the other side of a rainbow. Could there be a less beautiful image on the other side of one? Of course not, we all say. God created rainbows, and whatever God created is always perfect and beautiful.

But I couldn't stop thinking. So, I looked up a somewhat official description and gleaned these insights about rainbows. "Rainbows happen when sunlight is scattered from raindrops into the eyes of an observer. When light enters a water droplet, it slows down and bends as it goes from air to denser water. The light reflects off the inside of the droplet, separating into its component wavelengths or colors. In a Prism effect, the light that enters the drop is reflected from the inside of the drop and is refracted back again as it passes from water to air. An observer standing in the right place will see the dispersed sunlight reflected back towards them. Light scattered by many drops reaching the observer's eye will appear as a colorful rainbow. (Borrowed from Bing) Isn't science more interesting when you know our Omniscient God who created it?

Of course, Genesis 9:1-17 tells us of God's purpose for rainbows. Take a minute and read the story most of us are familiar with. Remember? Did you come to a screeching halt like I did when I read verses 14-16? "Whenever I bring the clouds... and the rainbow appears..., I will remember my covenant...Whenever the rainbow appears....I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and all living creatures..." Did you see it? There is another side to rainbows! It is God's side. Rainbows can be seen from more than one side! God doesn't need a reminder, but He carefully makes sure Noah knew, and we know, that any covenant, any promise God makes, not only will He not forget them, He will make sure He fulfills them.

Orphan Grain Train | \$100,000


