Proposed Bylaw Change

God's Blessings ladies of the Utah-Idaho District,
Upon review of the bylaws, the District Board has proposed these 3 changes. You will find the rationale, current wording and the proposed changes. We would ask you to prayerfully consider the changes.

Proposed 2024 Bylaws Amendments

Utah-Idaho District

1. Amend Article X, Appointed Personnel, by adding a new section and renumbering the following sections.

Rationale: To include the duties of the Social Media Facilitator in the bylaws.

Article X, Section 5 if adopted will read:

- a. The Social Media Facilitator shall:
Create an active presence for the District on social media platforms approved by the Vice President of Communication following national LWML social media guidelines;
- b. Follow national LWML social media as the Utah-Idaho District and share posts to District pages;
- c. Provide a forum for the Vice President of Communication and Public Relations Director to communicate via social media;
- d. Report to the Vice President of Communication.

The following sections will be renumbered.

2. Amend Article X, Section 1 and Article XI, Section 1, Paragraph d to include the Endowment Coordinator and the Young Woman Representative Committee and Heart to Heart Committee chairmen, and in the lists of appointed personnel and Board of Directors members.

Rationale: These women are appointed, as specified in Article VII, Section 2, and should be included in lists of appointed personnel.



These paragraphs now read:

Article X, Section 1

The appointed personnel shall be a Public Relations Director, Web Master, Editor, Archivist-Historian, Parliamentarian, Meeting Manager, and Nominating Committee Chairman. They shall:

Article XI, Section 1

d. Appointed personnel (Public Relations Director, Web Master, Editor, Archivist-Historian, Parliamentarian, Meeting Manager, and Nominating Committee Chairman).

If adopted, these paragraphs will read:

Article X, Section 1

The appointed personnel shall be a Public Relations Director, Web Master, Editor, Archivist-Historian, Parliamentarian, Meeting Manager, Nominating Committee Chairman, Endowment Coordinator, Young Woman Representative Committee Chairman and Heart to Heart Committee Chairman. They shall:

Article XI, Section 1

d. Appointed personnel (Public Relations Director, Web Master, Editor, Archivist-Historian, Parliamentarian, Meeting Manager, Nominating Committee Chairman, Endowment Coordinator, Young Woman Representative Committee Chairman and Heart to Heart Committee Chairman).

3. Amend Article XV, Section 2, Paragraph c to limit the District’s obligation for convention expenses to the budgeted amount.

Rationale:

1. As we develop the 2024-2026 biennium budget in early 2024 we cannot reasonably predict travel costs for the 2025 national convention. If this amendment is adopted the District’s expenses will be limited to the amount budgeted. We anticipate encouraging fundraising at the zone level to support delegate travel expenses and soliciting donations for YWR travel expenses.
2. Since the original bylaw was written we have sent first one, then two YWRs to the national convention. We anticipate sending a H2H sister in the future. The proposed amendment allows flexibility in who attends convention in an official District role.

These paragraphs now read:

Article XV, Section 2

The District President, zone delegates, and Pastoral Counselor shall attend the national LWML convention at District expense.

If adopted, these paragraphs will read:

Article XV, Section 2

The funds budgeted to support District representation at the national LWML convention shall be divided among the District President, zone delegates, Pastoral Counselor, YWR(s), and any others requested by the Executive Committee to attend the convention. The Executive Committee will establish criteria for allocating the funds among eligible persons.
